UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS AT EMORY At Emory University you'll find two distinct choices for your first two years of undergraduate education. You may choose to apply to **Emory College**, the four-year undergraduate division of Emory University in Atlanta, or you may apply to **Oxford College**, and spend your first two years at Emory's original campus thirty-eight miles east of Atlanta. Oxford students continue as juniors to Emory's main campus in Atlanta.

FOR ALL APPLICANTS

Application Plans

Emory's Common Application Supplement will be the form of record regarding your application plan; if you note a different plan on the Common Application, the plan(s) selected on this supplement will determine how your file is considered. If you are applying to both Emory College and Oxford College and the deadlines dates are different, the earlier deadline date will apply to both divisions. All application deadlines are postmark/submission deadlines. Your application will not be complete and will not be reviewed until the Common Application and Emory's supplement have been submitted.

Application Fee

The application fee for Emory College and Oxford College is \$50. If you are applying to both divisions, you will submit only one application fee. If you

apply to one division through Common Application site and later decide to apply to the other division, you will need to submit a paper application to the other division, but you do not have to submit an additional application fee.

Supporting Documents

Supporting documents required by Emory College and Oxford College such as the high school transcript, counselor recommendations, and SAT, ACT and/or TOEFL scores must be submitted to each school separately.

Admission Decisions

If applying to both Emory College and Oxford College, your application will be reviewed independently, and you will receive two admission decisions at the appropriate decision notification date for each division.

SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

International Applicants

International applicants must verify sufficient funding to cover expenses while attending Emory University by submitting a financial information form, along with documentation such as bank statements or letters of financial verification. You may download the needed form from the appropriate division's admission website. Note that only U.S. citizens and qualified noncitizens such as permanent residents can receive federal and institutional need-based financial aid.

Home-schooled Applicants

Home-schooled students are required to submit results from three SAT subject tests: Mathematics and two of your own choosing.

Early Admission Applicants

Academically exceptional students wishing to enter college after completing the eleventh grade may apply for early admission. Candidates are expected to complete all requirements for regular admission and meet the same standards of eligibility. Candidates must take the SAT I or ACT prior to the application deadline. A personal interview is highly recommended for early admission candidates.

Joint Enrollment Applicants

This admission plan serves local students who wish to take courses at Emory College or Oxford College while jointly enrolled in high school. These students must apply during their eleventh year of secondary school and must follow the same admission procedures as candidates for regular admission. Candidates must take the SAT I or ACT prior to the application deadline.

EMORY COLLEGE

Early Decision I and Early Decision II

If Emory College is your absolute first choice, you may choose one of two early decision (ED) options. Early decision plans are binding; meaning that if Emory College admits you and, if needed, provides adequate financial aid, you are willing to deposit and withdraw all other college applications. If you apply for financial aid, do not submit your ED admission deposit until you have received your aid package and determined that the package adequately meets your needs. When you deposit, you must also withdraw all other admission applications. A student may apply early decision to Emory College and early action to Oxford College, but if you are admitted to both divisions, you must withdraw your Oxford early action application and enroll at Emory College because the early decision plan is binding.

Emory Scholars Program and Goizueta Scholars Program

If you wish to be considered for the Emory Scholars or Goizueta Scholars

programs, you must also select an Emory admission plan: ED I, ED II, or regular decision. You may apply as a scholar nominee and as an early decision candidate, but do not do so if attendance at Emory is contingent upon receiving a merit scholarship. Scholar selections do not occur until April, and ED applicants must pay a binding deposit in January or February. Regardless of the admission plan, scholar applicants must submit all appropriate admission and scholar materials by November 1. You must be nominated by your high school for the scholar programs; nomination forms are mailed to guidance counselors in early fall. Your school may nominate you for the Emory Scholars and/or Goizueta Scholars program; each program has a unique nomination form and essay. If you apply to the Emory scholars programs, you may also apply to the Oxford Scholars Program.

Regular Decision

You may select regular decision for Emory College and also select early action or regular decision for Oxford College.

OXFORD COLLEGE

Early Action

Early action is nonbinding and allows you to learn of your admission decision early in the senior year. While applicants admitted under the early action program may consider Oxford College their first choice, they have until May 1 to make a final decision. If you apply early action to Oxford College, you may also apply to Emory College through an early decision or regular decision plan; however, if admitted to Emory College through an early decision plan, you must withdraw your application from Oxford College.

Oxford Scholars Program

If you wish to be considered for the Oxford Scholars Program, you must also

select an Oxford admission plan: early action or regular decision. You may self-nominate yourself for Oxford Scholars on this application; no additional nomination form is required. If you apply for the Oxford Scholars Program, you may also apply for the Emory Scholars and/or Goizueta Scholars program.

Regular Decision

If you apply regular decision to Oxford College, you may also apply to Emory College through an early decision or regular decision plan; however, if admitted to Emory College through an early decision plan, you must withdraw your application from Oxford College at the time of deposit.
