UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS AT EMORY At Emory University you'll find two distinct choices for your first two years of undergraduate education. You can choose to apply to **Emory College**, the four-year undergraduate division of Emory University, or you can apply to **Oxford College**, and spend your first two years at Emory's original campus thirty-eight miles east of Atlanta. Oxford students continue as juniors to Emory's main campus in Atlanta.

FOR ALL APPLICANTS

Application Plans

If you are applying to both Emory College and Oxford College and the deadlines dates are different, the earlier deadline date will apply to both divisions. All application deadlines are postmark deadlines. Please remember, you may only submit online through Common Application one time.

Application Fee

The application fee for Emory College and Oxford College is \$50.00. If you are applying to both divisions through the Common Application, you will submit only one application fee. If you apply to one division through Common Application and later decide to apply to the other division via a paper application or a different online service, you will need to submit an additional \$50.00 application fee to that division.

HOME-SCHOOLED AND INTERNATIONAL APPLICANTS

Home-schooled Applicants

Home-schooled students are required to submit results from three SAT subject tests: Mathematics and two of your own choosing.

International Applicants

International applicants must be able to verify the requisite funding for

EMORY COLLEGE

Early Decision I and Early Decision II

Students who select Emory College as their first choice and who wish to receive an admission decision early in their senior year may choose one of two early decision options. The early decision plans are binding, and students who are admitted must withdraw all other college applications at the time of deposit (provided they are offered adequate financial aid as determined by the financial aid office, if needed). Students who apply Early Decision to Emory College may apply to Oxford College through the Early Action or Regular Decision plan. Submitting a deposit for Early Decision I or Early Decision II serves as confirmation that: 1) If you applied for financial aid, you have received your package and on that basis you are depositing 2) That you will withdraw any outstanding admission applications to other schools.

Regular Decision

Students who select Regular Decision for Emory College may also select Early Action or Regular Decision for Oxford College.

Emory Scholars Program and Goizueta Scholars Program

Students who apply for the Emory Scholars Program or Goizueta Scholars Program must also select Early Decision I, Early Decision II, or Regular Decision. Scholar Program applicants who have selected the Early Decision I plan must submit the appropriate scholar materials by the Early Decision I

OXFORD COLLEGE

Early Action

The Early Action Program is nonbinding and allows students to learn of their admission decision early in the senior year. While applicants admitted under the Early Action Program may consider Oxford College their first choice, they have until May 1 to make a final decision. Students who apply Early Action to Oxford College may apply to Emory College through the Early Decision I, Early Decision II, or Regular Decision plan. However, if admitted to Emory College through the Early Decision I or Early Decision II plan, you are required to withdraw your application from Oxford College at the time of deposit.

Regular Decision

Students who select Regular Decision for Oxford College may also select Early Decision I, Early Decision II, or Regular Decision for Emory College. However, if admitted to Emory College through the Early Decision I or Early Decision II plan, you are required to withdraw your application from Oxford College at the time of deposit.

Supporting Documents

The following supporting documents are required by Emory College and Oxford College and must be submitted separately to both divisions if you are applying to both.

- Official SAT, ACT, and/or TOEFL test scores
- Official high school transcript
- Counselor recommendation
- Student signature (online)

Admission Decisions

If applying to both Emory College and Oxford College, your application will be reviewed independently, and you will receive two admission decisions at the appropriate decision notification date for each division.

deadline date. Scholar Program applicants who have selected Early Decision II or Regular Decision must submit the appropriate scholar materials by the scholar deadline date of November 1. The scholar application requires a separate nomination form and essay. The nomination form is mailed to guidance counselors in early fall. Students must be nominated by their high school for this program. Students may be nominated for either the Emory Scholars Program or the Goizueta Scholars Program, but not both. Students who apply to the Emory Scholars Program may also apply to the Oxford Scholars Program.

Early Admission

Academically exceptional students wishing to enter college after completing the eleventh grade may apply for early admission. Candidates are expected to complete all requirements for regular admission and meet the same standards of eligibility. Candidates must take the SAT I or ACT prior to the application deadline. A personal interview is highly recommended for early admission candidates.

Joint Enrollment

This admission plan serves Atlanta-area students who wish to take courses at Emory while jointly enrolled in high school. These students must have completed the junior year in secondary school and must follow the same admission procedures as candidates for regular admission. Candidates must take the SAT I or ACT prior to the application deadline.

Oxford Scholars Program

Students who apply for the Oxford Scholars Program must also select Early Action or Regular Decision. Students may self-nominate themselves for merit scholarships on the admission application (no supplement or nomination form is required). Students who apply for the Oxford Scholars Program may also apply for the Emory Scholars Program.

Early Admission
