## Yale Library Acquires LGBT Records

Over 30 years' worth of legal records documenting lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender history will find a home in Yale's library. Gay & Lesbian Advocates & Defenders (GLAD) is donating many of its legal records to Manuscripts and Archives in Sterling Memorial Library. Most of the resources, which range from photographs to financial records, will be open to researchers in early 2011. Yale will continue to receive records from GLAD as the organization releases more documents over the next 25 years.
