Congratulations and welcome to Emory University! To make your move-in as smooth and as hassle free as possible, we need to provide you with some important information prior to your arrival to the campus. Along with this letter, be sure to look over the move in portion of our website:

This page will assist you with move-in needs such as deciding what to bring with you as well as informing you on what items are prohibited in our residence halls. We also have guidelines regarding lofts and shipping items to campus. I urge you to contact me if you have any questions!

**Move in times...**

**All freshman residents are assigned a move-in time for opening day.** Please make sure you know your assigned time and arrive to campus as close to that time as possible. If you arrive early or late, you may have to wait longer than expected. If you're in Atlanta early, enjoy your morning with a great breakfast in the area or sleep in (depending on your assigned time), then head to campus!

**What to bring...**

Less is better! Remember, your room may be spacious, but storage and closet space is limited. Speak with your roommate and decide on who is going to bring certain items, and what you can buy in Atlanta. We have Target; Bed, Bath and Beyond; and even an IKEA nearby. Our staff will be happy to provide you with maps and directions to these places including some nearby restaurants and grocery stores.

**The Facts...**

Trimble and McTyiere Halls are in the center of campus. You'll live footsteps from the Woodruff PE Center and the Dobbs University Center. The PE Center, better known as the WoodPEC, will be where many of your orientation activities will take place. The University Center, known as the DUC, is the location of our dining hall.

**When you arrive...**

During move-in, traffic will be re-routed, and streets converted to one-way traffic to allow for easier access to our halls. The Emory Police Department (EPD) and Emory Parking Services will be assisting with traffic movement that day, so please help them by closely following directions provided.

When you arrive, you will be given a short amount of time to unload your car at the curbside. We suggest residents proceed inside to check in while other members of your party help unload the car. After unloading, you will be asked to park your car in one of our nearby parking decks. Shuttles will be running back and forth from the decks, so there isn't a need to worry about walking in the hot sun or getting lost on campus. Also, be sure to not leave your car unattended, park in a fire lane, or in specially marked parking spaces unless otherwise directed by EPD or Parking services. Doing so may result in a parking ticket or your car being towed.

We will provide you with a map of our area to better understand the traffic flow for your move-in. Please become familiar with this map and keep it handy as you head to Emory.
