As you are packing for the trip to your new home, we want to provide some important tips and reminders. First, bring less! Even though your room may be spacious, storage and closet space is limited. Emory police officers will be directing traffic on campus during Move In Day. Please note that areas in front of the halls will be for unloading only; no parking is allowed. It is very important that you pay attention to the check in time that you have been assigned to ensure a quick and efficient move in. Parking will be available in the Peavine and Michael Street Parking Decks. Please be mindful of the many pedestrians and limited parking when driving around campus.

Check in will occur on Saturday, August 22 from 7:30 AM to 2:00 PM in the lobby of your building. There will be plenty of people and signs to show you the way. Students, please make sure you bring a picture ID in order to begin the check-in process. Our staff will be giving you a lot of materials when you check in. Take the time to read over them.

We will have student volunteers who are willing and able to assist you with unloading your vehicle. They are present to help keep the flow of traffic and people moving. Residence Life staff will also be present throughout the day to assist you in whatever way we can. We are here to help your transition into college be as smooth as possible.

Your first mandatory hall meeting will be Saturday evening after your Orientation activities. The exact time will be posted on your hall. This is a wonderful time to meet your Resident Advisors, Sophomore Advisors, and your new hall mates.
