



Residence Life & Housing

Introduction

To foster community and to support residential students in pursuing common goals, the Office of Residence Life & Housing offers groups between 5-12 residential students opportunities to live in themed housing. A limited number of spaces will be allotted for theme housing in order to ensure adequate support exists.

To qualify for theme housing, residents must follow these steps:

- All residents must complete a Housing Contract
- Select one student as the Theme Housing Coordinator
- Secure a faculty or staff advisor
- Submit a completed application

Applications are due to 104 Alabama Hall by 5 p.m., January 26.

Finalists will be selected to present a 20-minute presentation to the Theme Housing Selection Committee on the afternoon of Friday, January 30.
