

Graduate Student Exit Survey Statistics, 2008-2009

- 76 percent are employed or have a definite job offer related to their most recent degree
- 68 percent plan to pursue a career in academia
- 90 percent ranked the intellectual quality of the faculty as “very good” or “excellent”
- 78 percent would recommend Emory to someone considering their graduate program
- 80 percent either “agreed” or “strongly agreed” that their interactions with faculty were good
- 84 percent either “agreed” or “strongly agreed” that faculty members were willing to work with them
- 88 percent of students were between twenty and thirty years old at the start of their program
- 88 percent either “agreed” or “strongly agreed” that their relationships with other students in their program was good
- 92 percent took a course, workshop, or orientation on teaching
- 56 percent co-authored in refereed journals with their program faculty
- 64 percent published as sole or first author in a refereed journal
- 68 percent ranked their overall experience at Emory as “very good” or “excellent”
- 46 percent of students accumulated no debt associated with their graduate school education
- On average, students graduated 5.8 years after beginning their program
