**I. Call to Order and Welcome**

University Senate president John Boli called the meeting to order at 3:20 p.m. The members were reminded to please sign the registration book. President Boli announced an orientation meeting for new members of the Senate for Tuesday, September 14, from 3:15-5:00 in Cox Hall, room 1.

**II. Approval of Minutes**

**III. Emory in the World**

President Boli presented the theme for the year: Emory and the World, the World and Emory, and Emory's World. He discussed the impact of globalization on Emory and the diverse composition of the faculty. The faculty were encouraged to write for popular journals and respond to the media in order to heighten the visibility of Emory. Several luncheons will be held to discuss the future of Emory in the World.

**IV. Remarks from Provost Rebecca Chopp**

Provost Chopp stated that there are 14 building projects on campus, and the SAT for the college is 1329. Fifty-eight percent of the entering class in the law school are female, and there are numerous important dean searches on campus this year.

**V. Report on Status of Senate Resolutions**

University Secretary Gary Hauk reported that the university administration declined the Senate resolution to lower the age of benefits. The high cost of the proposal was the problem. Dean Frances Lucas-Tauchar is in charge of the child care resolution, but funds are not yet available. Various persons are being considered for honorary degrees.
