If you are accepted for admission to Emory College, you are required to make a \$475 nonrefundable admission deposit to reserve your place in the college. Please note the following postmarked deadlines for receipt of this deposit. You also may pay your \$475 nonrefundable admission deposit online by visiting www.emory.edu/admission.

If you choose to pay online, you must sign and send your admission response and deposit card by the postmarked deadline.

First-year Student Acceptance Agreement

On accepting Emory's offer of admission by signing and returning the enclosed Admission Response and Deposit Card, you and your parents/guardians agree that during such time as you are enrolled, you will abide by the rules, regulations, practices, and policies of Emory University as they may be at the time of admission or as they may be changed during your continued enrollment in the University. These include the Honor Code of Emory College and the Emory University Undergraduate Code of Conduct. We will mail copies of these policies to accepted first-year college students, or you can review them at college.emory.edu/prospective/orientation/.

Early Decision I/II (if applicable)

Emory College subscribes to the first choice Early Decision plan, which requires you to certify that Emory is your first choice, and that you will accept an offer of admission if it is extended, provided the offer includes adequate financial aid, as determined by the Office of Financial Aid, if such is needed. A first-choice plan permits you to initiate other applications for admission should this seem advisable. If you are admitted to Emory College, you must withdraw all other college applications at the time of deposit (provided you are offered adequate financial aid as determined by the financial aid office, if needed). Submitting a deposit for Early Decision I or Early Decision II serves as confirmation that: (1) If you applied for financial aid, you have received your package, and on that basis you are depositing; (2) You will withdraw any outstanding admission applications to other schools. You may apply to only one school under an Early Decision plan.

Academics

We grant acceptance on condition that you continue to maintain, either in high school or at another college, at least as high a level of scholarship, personal conduct, and curriculum as that on which you tentatively were accepted to Emory College. Failure to maintain this level of academic achievement, curriculum, and/or conduct could result in a revocation of admission to Emory College. We grant acceptance on the assumption that you have indicated on your application all the subsequent academic work planned. If you wish to receive credit for attending another institution for summer or for special work after acceptance, you must obtain permission to do so.

Tests

If an accepted student retakes the SAT or ACT, the scores should be sent to Emory even though this will in no way affect the admission decision.

General Credit Policy Information

For entering first-year students a combined total of twenty-four credit hours of the following types of credit may be granted:

- (1) AP credits
- (2) IB, French Baccalaureate, A Level exams, and all other international exams credits
- (3) Other college credit
- (4) Transient study credits earned after the freshman year at Emory

Emory College will grant acceleration credit for courses beyond the 24 hours, but no additional credits will be given. Information regarding the next course to take in sequence based on acceleration credit will be provided as part of the credit evaluation. The maximum number of hours that can be awarded to an incoming transfer student is sixty-four semester hours. No more than twenty four of these credit hours can be awarded for AP and IB exams. Members of the admission staff, under the joint supervision of the dean of admission and the student academic affairs dean in the college, will evaluate college credit for entering students. **Official AP and IB test scores and college transcripts must be submitted to the Office of Admission by the end of your first semester on campus in order to be evaluated for credit.**

Final Transcript

You should give the final transcript release form to your high school principal or counselor. The school should fill it out and return it to Emory when you have graduated.

Final acceptance and clearance are granted only when Emory has received the final transcript form that includes a final high school date of graduation.

Financial Aid

Deferring Enrollment

If you wish to defer your enrollment for one year, you may request a deferment by writing to the Dean of Admission and paying the \$475 admission deposit by the appropriate deadline. To reserve a place in the following year's class, you must also make an additional, nonrefundable payment of \$1,000. This money will be credited toward tuition when you enroll at Emory.

Residence Halls

All Emory first-year and second-year students are required to live in Emory residence halls unless they commute from home. We guarantee you a room in a residence hall on accepting you to the college.
