Goizueta Scholars Program is for students in their last year of high school/secondary school who have demonstrated not only outstanding academic achievement and strong ethical character, but also a sustained interest in business and a propensity to create significant positive change in organizations. We additionally seek candidates with clear potential for enriching the lives of their contemporaries at Emory University. Goizueta Scholars awards are renewable for four years of undergraduate study, provided the recipients maintain high standards of personal and academic excellence. The BBA program provides an integrated undergraduate education that works in conjunction with extracurricular and other programmatic opportunities to help students craft a highly individualized experience based on their interests and aspirations. The program is committed to endowing its graduates with the knowledge, experience, and skills needed to achieve personal, intellectual, and professional growth and to have an ethical, significant impact on organizations and society.

Selection Timeline

November 15

The Goizueta Scholars Program nomination form (see reverse side) and the student's complete application for admission must be submitted (or postmarked) by this date.

Late January

Emory will designate approximately fifteen finalists from a pool of nominations that usually numbers more than two hundred students. Notification of your finalist status includes admission to Emory University and Goizueta Business School. All other nominees who apply through Regular Decision and who do not become semifinalists will learn of their admission decisions by April 1.

Mid-March

The Scholars Program finalists will interview on the Emory campus and learn more about Goizueta Business School. All finalists must participate in the finalist weekend; the University covers the finalists' expenses for travel, room, and board for the interview weekend.

April

Following the interview weekend, Emory will award to finalists approximately twelve to fifteen scholarships valued from 50 percent to 100 percent of the full cost of tuition and fees.

Nomination Requirements

To be considered for Goizueta Scholars, all materials required for the Regular Decision (or Early Decision) admission process must be submitted by **November 15**:

- Part 1: Emory Supplement (please indicate that you are a Goizueta Business School Scholars nominee)
- Part 2: Common Application
- Complete secondary school records or transcripts
- SAT I or ACT scores (and/or TOEFL score, if appropriate)
- Secondary school report (includes counselor recommendation)
- Nomination Form (see reverse side)
- Letter of recommendation from a teacher or professional who can describe the nominee's particular strengths, especially as they relate to business.
- Goizueta Scholars Essay: Write a brief essay (750 words) about yourself, focusing on your interest in, and passion for, business. We are particularly interested in the intersection between your academic accomplishments and your ability to translate that knowledge in an applied setting. Please provide an example of a way in which you have used your intellectual capacities, leadership abilities, and business acumen to have an impact on an organization, create a venture, or excel in a business-related activity. *Do not send a duplicate of your admission application essay.*



To the student:

Thank you for your interest in Emory and the Goizueta Scholars Program. Please complete the Student Information portion of this form (below) and, in addition to the Goizueta Scholars Essay, return it to your school counselor or appropriate school official. The nominating official should then complete their portion of the form, attach a letter of recommendation, and upload all documents to the Common Application.

Your complete admission application, supporting credentials, and the Goizueta Scholars Nomination Form must be submitted online (or postmarked) by November 15. Please indicate that you are an Goizueta Business Scholars nominee on the Emory Supplement.

Scholarship selection is based entirely upon a student's merit; financial need is not considered. If attendance at Emory is contingent upon receiving a merit scholarship, please apply Regular Decision, not Early Decision. Accepted Early Decision applicants must make a commitment to Emory well before the Emory Scholars selections, which occur in late March.

All nominees should be aware that if selected as Goizueta Scholar finalists, you are required to interview on the Emory campus from March 14-17, 2012. The University covers the finalists' expenses for travel, room, and board during the interviews.

To the high school:

Thank you for your nomination(s) to the Goizueta Scholars Program. Any secondary school in the United States or abroad is invited to make one nomination each year. Candidates for this selective competition must be nominated by appropriate officials of their secondary schools. The signature of the nominating school official or counselor must accompany this form.

As you are considering your candidates for nomination, please be aware of the highly competitive nature of our scholar pool. On the whole, the students who are successful nominees are those with superior grades, extraordinary test scores, and an already-proven propensity to excel in a business-related field. Students nominated for the Emory Scholars Program may also be nominated for the Goizueta Scholars Program.

To nominate a student for the Goizueta Scholars Program, please complete the Nominating Official Information below. All applicants to Emory are required to submit a recommendation from their current college adviser or guidance counselor. Nominees for the Goizueta Scholars Program must also submit one teacher or professional recommendation. In the recommendation, please describe the nominee's particular strengths, especially as they relate to busi-

ness, and tell us what makes the candidate distinctive. Please be sure to indicate nuances within the student's chosen academic program that you feel the scholars review committee would benefit from hearing.

Please scan and email Goizueta Scholars nomination materials (nomination form, letter of recommendation, and essay) to admission.processing@emory.edu. As in years past, we prefer that admission application materials be submitted electronically. Please submit transcripts, school reports, and other supporting materials online through Naviance, etc.

If you must submit a paper application, we ask that all Goizueta Scholars nomination materials be mailed together, along with the complete application for admission, all recommendations, and school records or transcripts, to Emory University, Office of Admission—Undergraduate, 3263-001-1AA, 1390 Oxford Road NE, Atlanta, Georgia 30322-1016.
