



- To be considered for the Emory Scholars Program, students must be nominated by the appropriate officials of their secondary schools.
- The Scholars Program nomination form and the student's complete application for admission must be postmarked by November 1, 2009. For students enrolled outside the United States, all nomination and application materials must arrive in the Emory Office of Admission by November 1, 2009.
- All nominees for the Emory Scholars Program are required to respond to an additional essay prompt and submit a teacher recommendation in addition to the required counselor recommendation. Please see the nomination form for specific information.
- Any secondary school in the United States or abroad may nominate up to four students.
- Students nominated for the Emory Scholars Program **may also** be nominated for the Goizueta Scholars Program.
- Scholarship selection is based entirely upon a student's merit; financial need is not considered.
- All awards are renewable for four years of undergraduate study, provided the recipients maintain high standards of personal and academic excellence. Scholars must maintain a cumulative college GPA of 3.2 or better.
- In addition to the scholarship, scholars receive preference in upperclass housing and course selection.
- Distinguished faculty serve as program directors and advisers, helping scholars to plan and implement their activities and facilitating their access to the academic and cultural opportunities of the University and Atlanta.
- The University provides scholars a stipend to attend cultural, social, and educational events.
- Scholars may use their awards to study abroad during the academic year with any of Emory's semester or yearlong programs. Each year a large group of selected scholars receive full-tuition awards to attend one of Emory's summer study abroad programs.
- Scholars also may spend their summers in Atlanta participating in Emory Scholars Living/Learning Community. Participants live together but work individually with local service organizations. Intellectual leadership development, as well as ethical and personal reflection and community building are central to the program.

### SCHOLAR CALENDAR

#### November

**NOVEMBER 1** The Scholars Program nomination form and the student's complete application for admission must be postmarked by this date. For students enrolled outside the United States, all nomination and application materials must arrive in the Emory Office of Admission by November 1.

#### January

**LATE JANUARY** Emory will designate approximately 350 semifinalists from a pool of nominations that usually numbers more than two thousand students. Notification of your semifinalist status includes admission to Emory College. All other nominees who do not become semifinalists will learn of their admission decisions by April 1.

#### March

**MID MARCH** The University will select approximately seventy-five finalists from the pool of semifinalists. To the group of semifinalists who do not become finalists, Emory will also offer approximately seventy-five Deans Achievement Scholarships of two-thirds tuition.

**LATE MARCH** The Scholars Program finalists will interview on the Emory campus. All finalists must participate in these interviews; *the University covers the student's travel expenses for travel, room, and board for the interview weekend.*

#### April

Following the interview weekend, Emory will award to finalists approximately twenty-five scholarships valued at the full cost of tuition, fees, room, and board. The University also will award approximately fifty full-tuition scholarships.
