I am writing to invite your participation in two collaborative opportunities: with the Emory Alumni Association and the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute.

First, the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI), part of Emory Lifelong Learning, is finalizing their Fall Schedule. It will be finished within the next two weeks. If you would like to participate in a “Great Lectures” series (September 22—November 12), please let me know **this week**. There is a chance of creating a series for the Winter session, which begins in mid- to late-January. Both series run for eight weeks, and lectures may be on the topic of your choice. The second opportunity is with the Emory Alumni Association’s Faculty Programming (*see the attached brochure*). Two programs in particular have stood out as potentially good fits with emeriti professors. I am posting information from their brochure below so you have a better idea of what these programs offer and how you might help or benefit from them. This would be a wonderful way for those of you who travel frequently or live outside of Atlanta to remain an integral part of the Emory community.

- 1) **Faculty Destinations:** **Faculty Destinations** is the EAA’s distinguished speaker series. It’s not always easy for alumni to come back to campus; through Faculty Destinations, the EAA brings the campus to alumni. Faculty Destinations highlights Emory faculty from every school and academic unit. Presentations range from groundbreaking research to newly published books and articles, to commentary on art or history exhibits. Presentations are frequently podcast and archived on the EAA website, offering easy access to alumni who cannot attend in person.
- 2) **Faculty On the Road:** The EAA knows faculty do some of their best teaching outside the classroom. Sometimes, it’s even outside Emory’s own programs. That’s why we created **Faculty on the Road**. If faculty are featured speakers or attendees at a conference in another city or at another university, we can connect them to the local Emory community no matter where they are. Whether it’s a casual dinner with alumni or a program audience augmented with friendly Emory faces, being on the road doesn’t have to mean our professors are far from home.
