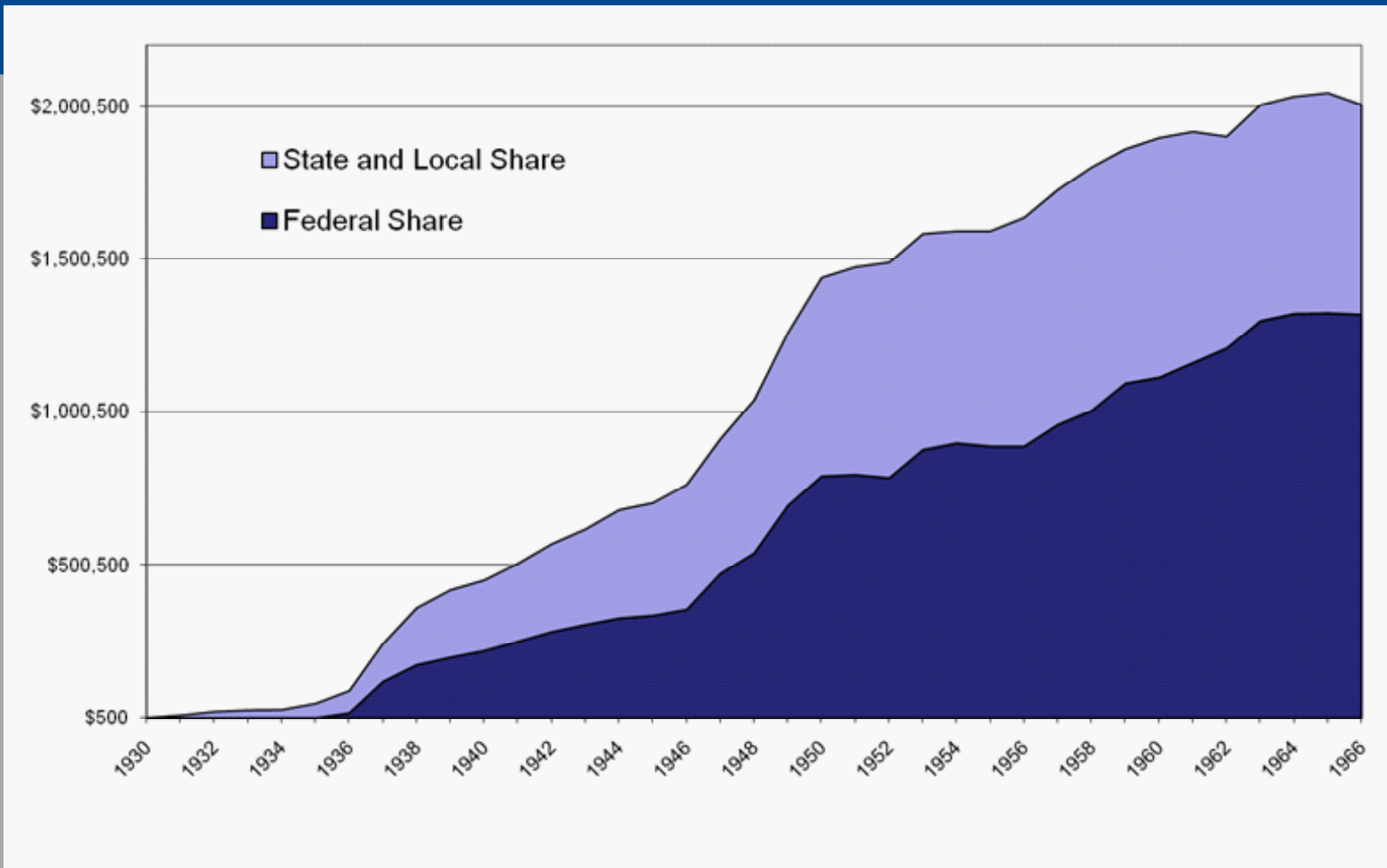

Old-Age Assistance Program Expenditures: FY 1930-1966 (in thousands of dollars)



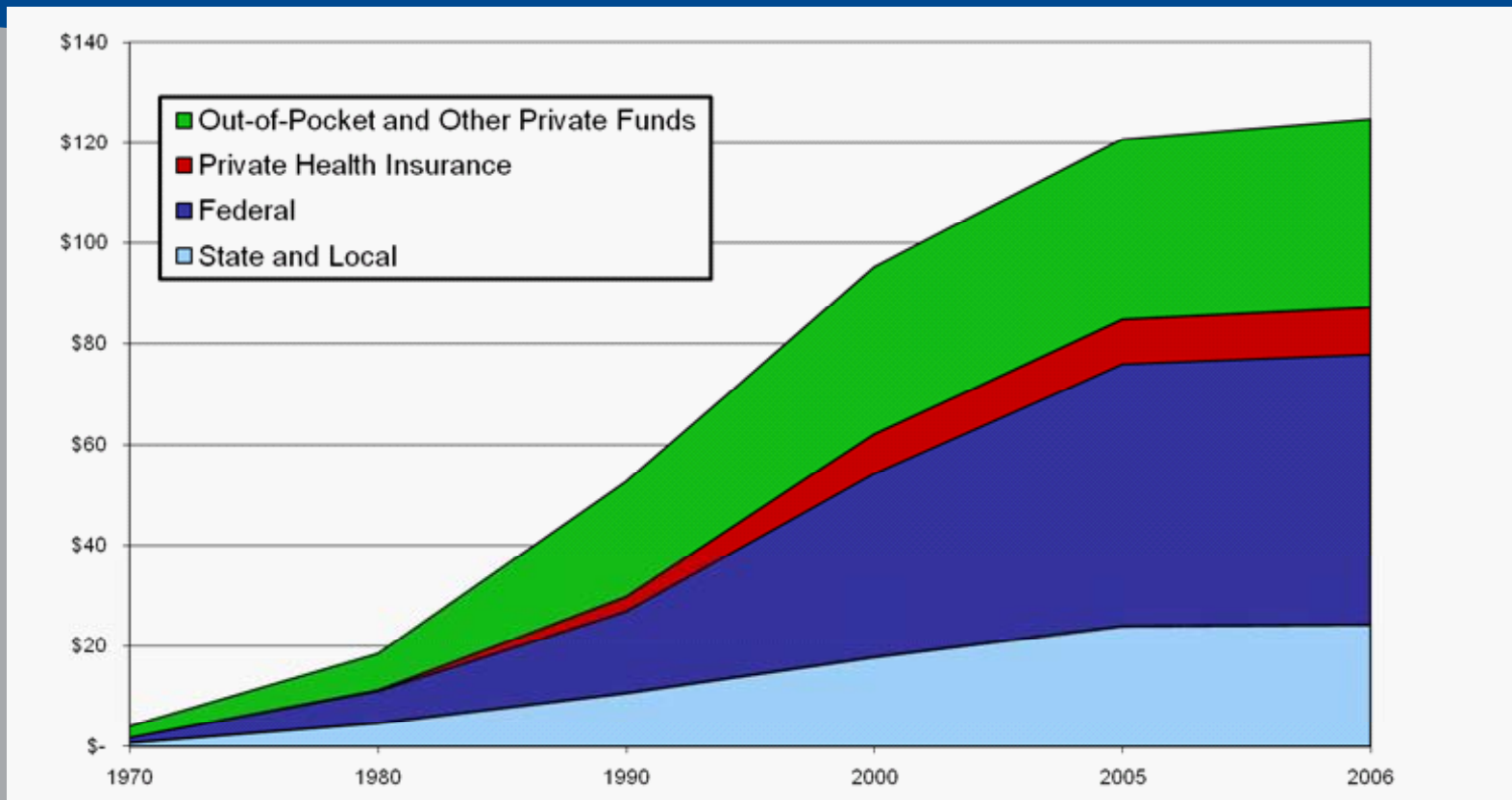

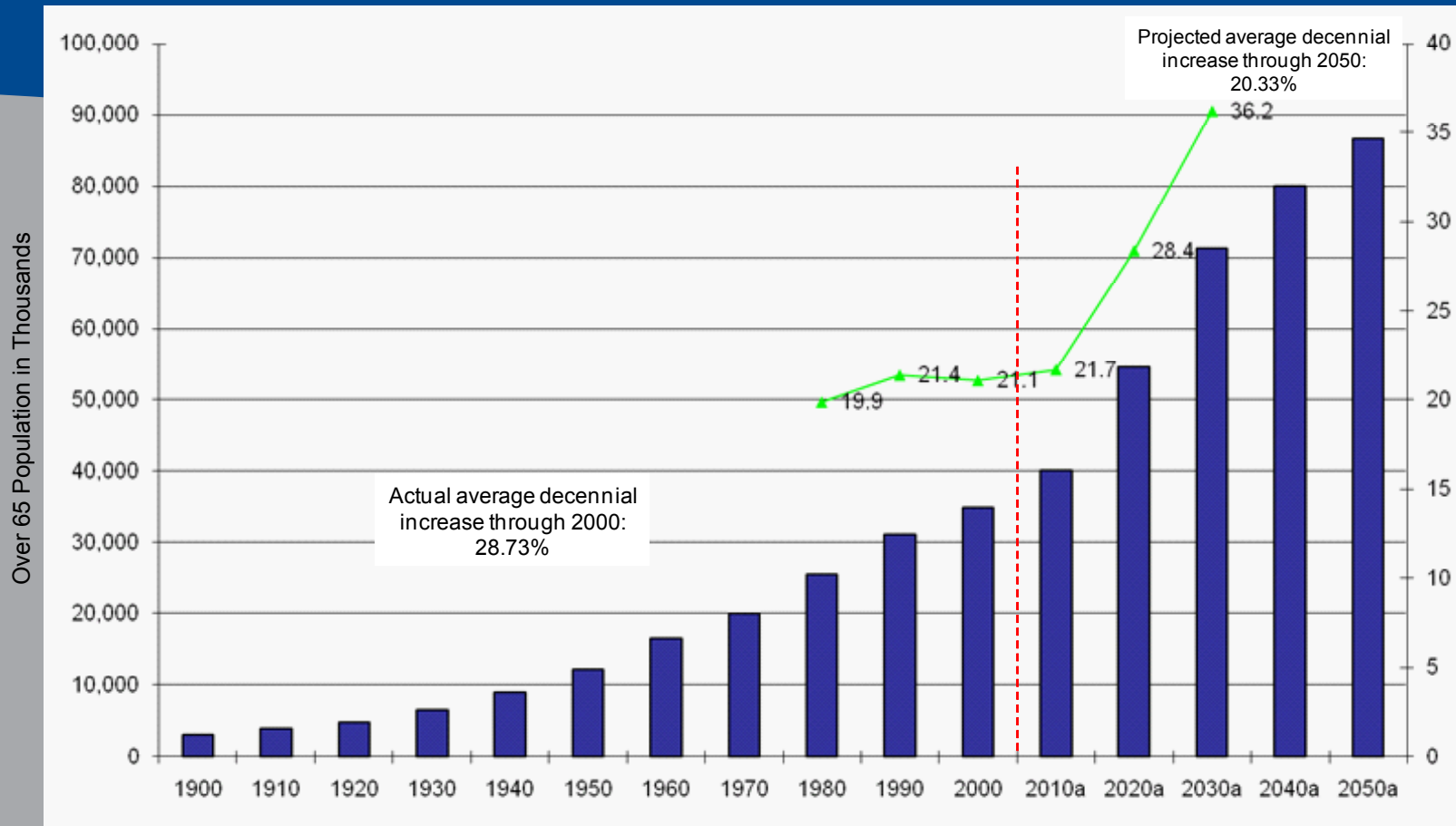
Nursing Home Care Expenditures: Selected Years, 1970-2006 (Dollars in Billions)
