

Emory Clubs

All Emory Clubs exist under the sanctions of the Student Government Association. The SGA consists of representatives from each school of the University. It oversees the operation of all student organizations on campus, approves annual budgets of student activities, and supervises the disbursement of student activity fees to each organization.

Students Interest and Activity Clubs

UNDERGRADUATE CLUBS

The following clubs are chartered under College Council. The College Council is the student representative governing and funding organization of Emory College. In addition to sponsoring a variety of activities, the council appoints students to College and University committees and so encourages them to play active roles in the affairs of such policy-making committees as the Educational Policy Committee, the Curriculum Committee, the Admissions and Scholarship Committee, the Committee on Academic Standards, the Conduct Council, and the Honor Council.

Model United Nations. To bring an understanding of International relations and culturally diverse politics to Emory's campus.

Pre-Law Society- creates a forum to learn about and prepare for a career in law.

Pre-Physical Therapy Organization. To provide support and information to pre-physical therapy students regarding the field of physical therapy and graduate programs.

Pre-Vet - seeks to create a forum that provides assistance and support to Emory students interested in an animal related career.

Science and Society- Science & Society's mission is to enable the Emory community to better understand the ramifications of science on the social sphere and the importance of science as a way of thinking. The goal is to increase awareness and understanding of science in our everyday lives and how that science integrates with the environment, the economy, our health, entertainment, transportation, how we think, and how we express our thoughts.

The Emory Wheel, which has won top national student press awards, covers the gamut of news of interest to the Emory community. The paper offers experience to students in all aspects of journalism.

WMRE - to serve the Emory community's broadcast radio needs as best as possible in music broadcasts, concerts, DJ services, specialized programing, special events and any other services that the Emory community deems necessary.

CLUBS IN THE GRADUATE SHOOOLS

These clubs are chartered and governed by their divisional council, which I have listed as the first club under each category. All of the Graduate divisions also have representation on the Graduate Senate. All clubs ultimately fall under the Student Government Association.

ALLIED HEATH

Allied Health Divisional Council- representative body of the students in the Allied Health division and liaison to the SGA. This divisional council works to insure a forum for the expression of ideas concerning the social, moral, and intellectual aspects of student life.

Anesthesia Assistants Club- provides services and programming for the students in the Anesthesia Program at Emory

Harry Williams Physician Assistant Program- is the official organization for the PA program. It provides social, service, and educational opportunities.

Physical Therapy Program- expresses concerns of the students in the PT program and provides them with a forum for the expression of ideas concerning the social, moral, and intellectual aspects of student life.

Radiology Technology- student chapter of the Atlanta Society of Radiologic Technologists; plans educational, service and social opportunities for its members.

BUSINESS

BBA- Undergraduate Divisional Council- represents the Business School students within the school and within the university, promotes the growth and development of the school in the best interests of the students, and strengthens the relations between the students and the faculty.

Grad Business Divisional Council- works to create a fun and cohesive community of academic excellence for the graduate business students.

Beta Alpha Psi- accounting fraternity that strives to promote high scholarship and ethical standards in its members

Jd-MBA Society- students in dual degree program between the law school and the business school and others interested in how these two fields relate.

GRADUATE ARTS AND SCIENCES

BGSA- Black Graduate Student Association- is dedicated to the enhancement of the graduate experience for African-American students and students of African descent at Emory University. The organization has been established to serve as a foundation for building unity, support, and academic excellence among these students as well as the greater Emory community.

Chinese Student Union- is a cultural, social, and academic organization for Chinese graduate students

DSAC- Advisory Board for the Division of Biological and Biomedical Sciences.

GAP- Jewish Grad. & Professional Students- provides student run, Jewish oriented programs and services to the Emory community

GIN-Graduates in Neurosciences- allows a forum for students to discuss the field of neurosciences and connect to professional in the field.

MD-PhD Student Association- Club for students who are jointly enrolled in the Graduate School of Arts and Sciences and the Medical School.
